## Make a Plan to Vote in the November 8 General Election

Voting is underway in the **November 8** General Election. Minnesota registered voters can still <u>request an absentee ballot</u> to vote from home at the <u>Secretary of State's website</u>, vote early with an absentee ballot at a <u>local election office</u>, or vote on Election Day at their <u>polling place</u>. The deadline to pre-register to vote has now passed. Eligible Minnesotans can still register when they go to vote at their polling place on Election Day with a <u>proof of residence</u>.

If voting from home, Minnesotans must complete the witness section on the ballot envelope and ensure the ballot is received by elections officials on or before November 8.
